Just a week before, James was sitting in clinic, where the prick of a needle for his blood test barely even made him jump. Felicia was brought to tears as she faced the reality that the treatment her son was facing had become a normal part of

life. Of course, she was so thankful for the care James was receiving, but any mother hates seeing her child face the slightest uncomfortable treatment – especially when he had been undergoing this treatment that included multiple medications per day, regular testing, and frequent hospital stays for more than ten years.

Felicia looked up at James and smiled. When he grinned back at her, she knew what he was thinking about. Instead of focusing on the blood work, he was focusing on his upcoming *magic moment* – including his first flight on a jet – en route to Disney World.
